Mrs. Joshua Krick of This City Passes - Away At an Early Hour

Apoplexy Is Cause - Suffered Her First Stroke of Paralysis Over Eighteen Months Ago

Mrs. Joshua Krick of this city died at an early hour this morning after suffering about two years from apoplexy. Eighteen months ago, Mrs. Krick had her first stroke of paralysis from which she partly recovered, although her left side was left somewhat paralyzed. The last attack she suffered was on Sunday. This was a very severe one, which resulted in her death at 1 o'clock this morning. Mrs. Krick was born in Blue Creek Township, Adams County, Indiana, in the year 1856. She was always been a resident of Adams County. The deceased leaves a husband, who is employed at the Krick & Tyndall tile factory, being a brother of Henry Krick, and two sons, John and George. John is a fireman on the Pennsylvania lines out of Fort Wayne, while George makes his home in this city with his parents.

The funeral services will be held Friday morning from the house, the Rev. Love officiating. Burial will take place in the Blue Creek Cemetery.
