MRS. WORKINGER DEATH'S VICTIM

Mrs. Charles Workinger Dies At Home In Blue Creek Township

Mrs. Armanda Elizabeth Meyers Workinger, 69, died at 6:45 this morning at her home one and one half miles south and five miles east of Monroe. Death was caused by ulcers of the stomach.

The deceased was born October 6, 1868, a daughter of Jacob and Nancy Meyers of Blue Creek Township. She was a member of the United Brethren Church and spent her entire life in Blue Creek Township.

Surviving besides the husband, Charles Workinger, are the following children, Mrs. L. L. Ray of Willshire; Glen of Monroe Township; Harry and Loy of Fort Wayne; one brother, Fred Meyers, of Blue Creek and two sisters, Mrs. A. C. Conterman of Blue Creek and Mrs. J. C. Frank of Washington Township.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday at 10 o'clock (EST) at the home and 10:30 o'clock at the Union U. B. Church, with burial in the Tricker Cemetery. Rev. E.E. Bragg will have charge of the services.

The body was removed from the Lobenstein Funeral Home in Monroe early this afternoon and may be viewed at the residence.
