

**Moses E. Myers Is Found Dead At Home
Funeral Services Friday Afternoon**

Moses E. Myers, 64, Blue Creek township, was found dead at his home two and three-fourths miles southeast of Salem Tuesday afternoon. Death was caused by a heart attack, which he apparently suffered late Monday afternoon, shortly after his return home from Decatur.

His body was found by a son, Elmer, who lives on a nearby farm. Mr. and Mrs. Myers had been in Decatur Monday afternoon, Mrs. Myers remaining in Decatur while her husband returned home.

The deceased was born in Wells county Sept. 8, 1883, but had resided in Adams county most of his life. His first wife, Bertha Tumbleson, died in 1931, and he was married to Ida Hirschy in 1934. He was a member of the Mt. Hope church.

Surviving in addition to the wife are five sons, Dwight, Howard and Paul Myers, all of Decatur, Elmer of Blue Creek township, and Ralph of Berne; one daughter, Mrs. Edith Yaney of Rockford, O.; four brothers, John of Courtland, O., Rufus, Lee and Samuel, all of Warren, O.; three sisters, Mrs. Rosetta Cook and Mrs. Cecil Villard of Lewisburg, O., and Mrs. Goldie Jewell of Warren, O., and a half-sister, Mrs. Ida Hackman of Berne. One daughter is deceased.

Funeral services will be held at 1:30 p.m. Friday at the home of the son, Elmer, and at 2 o'clock at the Mt. Hope church, with the Revs. Dwight McCurdy and Ralph G. Merritts officiating. Burial will be in the Mt. Hope cemetery. The body will be removed from the Zwick funeral home to the Elmer Myers residence Thursday morning.
