Philip W. Rehm, 66, route 1, Monroe, who retired from International Harvester Co. in 1976 after 32 years of service, died at 8:30 p.m. Friday in Adams County Memorial Hospital, following a brief illness.

He attended Mt. Hope Church of the Nazarene, and was a longtime union steward. He also was a veteran of World War II and the Korean Conflict. Born in Allen County on September 20, 1918, he was the son of Edward and Ada Fleming-Rehm, and was married to Bertha Bebout; she survives.

Also surviving are three sons, Rick, Rod and Kevin, all of route 1, Monroe; two sisters, Ruth Rehm, Fort Wayne, and Mrs. Louis (Alice) Houser, Venice, Fla; a brother, Tom Rehm, Fort Wayne; and a grandson, Brendan. Two brothers preceded in death.

Services will be held Monday at 1:30 p.m. at Mt. Hope Church of the Nazarene, Rev. Dean Pickett officiating. Burial will be in Mt. Hope Cemetery. Friends may call at Winteregg-Linn & Haggard Funeral Home from 2 to 5 and 7 to 9 p.m. Sunday and from 9 a.m. until noon Monday, and then at the church one hour prior to services.
