

Second Fatality Results from Auto Accident

Decatur, Ind., Aug. 10-- The second fatality from the automobile accident of a week ago last Saturday resulted when Jess Andrews, unmarried, 25 (or 28), died at the home of his parents Mr. and Mrs. Perry Andrews, near Monroe. He was partially paralyzed, following severe injury to his back. The first fatality was the death of his brother, Wade Andrews, who was instantly killed when their automobile was overturned. John Andrews, the third brother injured, it is believed will recover.

JESSE ANDREWS FUNERAL HELD TODAY AT MONROE
HE WAS SECOND VICTIM OF AUTO ACCIDENT --- OTHER DEATHS

This afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Monroe M. E. Church, Monroe, Adams County, took place the funeral of Jesse Andrews, the second victim of the automobile accident which occurred near Preble on Saturday afternoon, August 1st. He was aged 28 and was the youngest of the three brothers who were in the E. M. F. car that overturned. He was unmarried. His brother, Wade, was killed instantly, while John Andrews, owner of the machine was not dangerously hurt and is well on the road to recovery. Jesse lived eight days, passing away Sunday afternoon. Surviving Jesse Andrews are his parents, Perry Andrews and wife, six brothers, and two sisters.

SECOND DEATH IN AUTO ACCIDENT
JESSE ANDREWS DIED SUNDAY AFTERNOON FROM HIS INJURIES

Jesse Andrews, 28 years old, died at 3:30 o'clock Sunday afternoon from injuries received in the automobile accident, near Preble, one week ago Saturday evening. An injury of the spine caused paralysis of the lower limbs and the physicians held little hope for his recovery from the first. The death is the second to result from the automobile accident, Wade Andrews, having been killed instantly, John Andrews, the other brother in the machine at the time, getting along nicely and will soon be as well as ever.

The automobile containing the three brothers were enroute to their home near Monroe from Preble. All were intoxicated, it is said, and when the machine hit an obstruction while traveling at a great rate of speed, the car was turned over. Wade Andrews was dead when taken from under the machine and Jesse Andrews was not expected to survive only a few hours.
