**ABRAHAM BRANDYBERRY**

Abraham Brandyberry, of Monroe, died last Thursday, after a few weeks of agonizing suffering from a painful carbunkle, which began its poisonous powers on the back of his neck. It grew in size until it was fully ten inches in length. It was some three weeks ago when its first appearance was noticed. Death resulted from blood poison. The funeral services were held Friday afternoon with interment at the Chapel cemetery, three miles south of Monroe. He was an uncle of Auditor Brandyberry.
