Albert "Bub" Cook, 63, 422 S. Fifth Street, outside foreman for the Decatur Water Department, died at 7:20 a.m. Sunday, Christmas Day, at Adams County Memorial Hospital, where he had been a patient four days.

He was employed by the city of Decatur since 1947, working for the light plant from 1947 - 1959, and the water department since 1960.

He was born in Union Township on February 25, 1925; the son of William H. and Pearl Mae Gause Cook, and was married to Maxine C. Faus; she survives. Also surviving are two daughters, Cynthia M. Raudenbush, and Mrs. Dave (Shirley A.) One sister, Betty Kipfer, and one brother, Roy Cook, are deceased.
