## WELL-KNOWN MAN IS DEAD

Albert Klopfenstein, 33, Dies Early Today After Long Illness

Albert Klopfenstein, aged 33, well-known Monroe township young man, died this morning at 2:20 o'clock at the home of his parents, southwest of Monroe. The young man had been ill since March, and underwent an operation in April. For weeks he was critically ill, then rallied, but had been in a serious condition again the past several days. He had been confined to bed most of the time since his sickness started. The young man was a nephew of Mrs. Cary Templin of Berne.

Albert Klopfenstein was born Sept. 9, 1904, in Monroe township, a son of Peter P. and Mary Klopfenstein. Previous to his illness, he was employed with Yost Brothers. He was not married.

Surviving are the parents, and the following brothers and sisters: Henry, Monroe; Noah, Fort Wayne; Mrs. Aldine Ginter, Decatur; Mrs. Emma Mallonee, Decatur; Mrs. Tillie Ehram, Monroe; Mrs. Ida Egly, Monroe; and Mrs. Mary Mertz, Bluffton. Two sisters and one brother preceded.

The funeral will be held Saturday afternoon at 1 o'clock at the home and at 1:30 o'clock at the Winchester U. B. church. Rev. Dellinger, pastor of the U.B. church, will officiate. The body will be taken to the home of his parents Friday morning from the Lobenstein funeral home at Monroe.
