O.T. Hendricks Dies at Monroe

Prominent Retired Farmer Dies of Pneumonia This Afternoon

Oliver Thomas Hendricks, 83, retired farmer and one of Monroe's best known citizens, died at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon following a four days illness of pneumonia.

Oliver T. Hendricks was born May 2, 1845 in Monroe, the son of Bazzell and Mary Hendricks. His entire life period was spent in Monroe.

Mr. Hendricks was twice married. His first wife, Mary Etta Walton Hendricks preceded him in death about eighteen years ago. He then married her sister Mariah Walton. No children were born of either union.

Two brothers, Jacob D. Hendricks, of Monroe, and John W. Hendricks of Pittsburg, Florida: one half-brother James A. Hendricks of Monroe and two half-sisters, Mrs. Hattie Sells and Mrs. Minnie Albaugh, the latter of Dennison, Ohio, survive.

Mr. Hendricks retired from active farming about 20 years ago. He was a member of the Methodist Church in Monroe, and one of the leading workers in that organization. No funeral arrangements have been made.
