Died at Bowerstown At Home of His Son, John Kirkendall

Death Due to Paralysis

James Kirkendall, well known aged man, for many years a resident of near Monroe, died yesterday at the home of his son, John Kirkendall, in Bowertown, Ohio. Death was due to paralysis, he having sustained a number of attacks.

The body will be brought back to the old home town for the funeral, and will be taken to the home of James Kessler, until the time of the funeral which will be held at the Monroe Methodist church.

Mr. Kirkendall went to Ohio to live with his son a number of years ago, following the death of his wife. He was seventy-five or eighty years of age. He is survived by two sons and a daughter.
