Carl G. Bieberich, 81, of Decatur, who served at the White House as a guard for Eleanor Roosevelt, died Saturday, May 13, 2000, at home.

The Adams County native was a retired farmer and also worked for Fruehauf Trailers. He served in the Army during World War II and was a member of Salem United Methodist Church of Christ and American Legion Post 43.

Surviving are daughters Lois McIntosh and Marlene D. Equia, both of Decatur; a son, Carl of Decatur; sisters Mary Worthman of Bronson, Mich., and Della Carpenter of Everett, Wash.; a brother, Henry of Fort Wayne; and six grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Florence M., a grandchild and several brothers and sisters.

Services are 11 a.m. Wednesday at the church, with calling one hour prior to services. Calling will also be held from 6 to 8 p.m. today and from 2 to 4 and 6 to 8 p.m. Tuesday at Haggard and Sefton Funeral Home, Decatur. Burial will be at Salem-Magley Cemetery, Decatur.
