## ELIZABETH BLOEMKER DIES THIS MORNING

Magley Resident is Taken by Death

Mrs. Elizabeth Bloemker, 72, a resident of Magley, died this morning at ? o'clock at the Adams county memorial hospital, following an illness of four weeks. Death was attributed to complications as the result of seven years of diabetes.

The deceased was born in Germany November 26, 1872, a daughter of Fred and Elizabeth Conrad Schneble. She was married in Louisville, Ky., April 11, 1912, to Fred Bloemker, who survives.

She was a member of the Salem Evangelical and Reformed church in Magley, where she resided for the past 18 years. Prior to that time she was a resident of Wells county.

Children surviving include Mrs. Lilly Anna Borne of Louisville, Mrs. Mary Worthman of route 1, Ossian; Mrs. Alma Reppert of Canada; Louis Manns and George Manns, both of Tocsin. The children are of a former marriage to John Manns, which occurred in Louisville, Ky., April 21, 1891(?).

Also surviving are 11 grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren, together with the following brothers and sisters: Mrs. Leo Burns, Louisville; Mrs. Lucy Grady, Denver, Colorado; Mrs. Ellis Lucher of Cleveland, Ohio; John Schneble of Louisville; Otto Schneble of Massachusetts. Two sisters and three brothers are deceased.

Funeral services will be held Monday afternoon at 1:30 at the home and at 2 o'clock in the church at Magley, with burial in the Magley cemetery. Rev. John Meichals will officiate.

The body will be returned this evening to the home from the Jahn funeral home in Bluffton.
