REV. CHAS. REPERT DIES IN WISCONSIN

Rev. Charles Reppert, 59, pastor of the Evangelical and Reformed church at Elkhart Lake, Wisc., a native of Adams county, died Saturday at his home there following a heart attack.

He was born Oct. 10, 1889 in Preble township, Adams county, to Christ and Mary Speine Reppert. His marriage to Alma Mann took place at Magley on July 7, 1921.

After his graduation from the Mission at Sheboygan, Wisc., his charge was at Stony Plain, Alberta, Canada, where he was located for 23 years before going to Wisconsin.

Surviving are the wife; two sons, Raymond Reppert of British Columbia; and Carl [sic] Reppert, at home; one daughter, Alma Reppert, at home; three sisters, Mrs. Lena Fruchte of Magley, Mrs. Jason Hoffman of San Francisco, Calif.; Mrs. Ralph Worthman of Millersburg; and three brothers, George of Freeport, Ill., Walter of Magley, and Elmer of Fort Wayne.

The body will arrive in Fort Wayne Wednesday and will be brought to the Jahn funeral home.

At 12 noon Thursday the body will be taken to the Magley Evangelical and Reformed church to lie in state until funeral services at 2 o'clock, with Rev. Herb Meussling officiating. Burial will be in the church cemetery.
