OSWALD REPPERT DEAD NEAR MAGLEY

DECATUR, Ind., Nov. 28 - Oswald G. Reppert, 33, son of the late Jacob Reppert, a prominent young Preble township farmer, died at his home after an operation here Saturday following a short illness of ulcers of the stomach and bowels. His wife, who was formerly Miss Minnie Bienenke, and a son, five years old, survive. He also leaves a brother and two sisters, Albert Reppert, of Kirkland township, and Mrs. John Miller and Mrs. Dan Scherry, of near Magley. The funeral will be held tomorrow afternoon at 1:30 o'clock at the Magley Reformed church.

YOUNG FARMER IS STRICKEN

Decatur, Ind., Nov. 30 - Funeral services will be held this afternoon at the German Reformed church, near Magley, for Oswald G. Reppert, one of the best known farmers in the northern part of Adams county, whose death occurred at his home in Preble township, a mile north of Magley. He was suddenly stricken with illness last Friday at the home of Daniel Weiffel, a neighbor, for whom he had been assisting in shredding corn, the attack coming on without warning while he was at the dinner table. He had seemed to be in perfect health. An operation was performed at his home Saturday by Drs. M. F. Porter and M. F. Porter, Jr., of Fort Wayne, but it was unavailing and he died Sunday. He was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Reppert, pioneers of Preble township, and was born in 1882 on the farm where he died. A widow and little son survive.
