Services will be held Saturday at 2 p.m. in Salem United Church of Christ, Magley, with Rev. Gerald Newbold officiating for Amanda Worthman, 93, formerly of route 2, Decatur, who died at 11:30 a.m. Thursday in Decatur Community Care Center. She had resided there for almost three years.

She was a former employee of the General Electric Co. and the Preble Tomato Factory, but had spent most of her working life as a housekeeper.

She was a lifelong member of the Salem United Church of Christ, Magley, Ladies Aid, Women's Guild, Ever Welcome Sunday School Class. She made her home with her sister, Ella Scherry, for 40 years prior to moving to the Care Center.

Born in Preble Township, Adams County, on Sept. 21, 1891, she was the daughter of Lewis and Sophia Bloemker-Worthman, and was never married.

Survivors include the sister, Mrs. Milton (Ella) Scherry, route 2, Decatur; 17 nieces and six nephews. One sister and five brothers - Martin, Rev. Edward, Lena Hilgeman, Ernest, Rev. Matthew, and Lewis - preceded her in death.
