

Fort Wayne Sentinel, Allen County, Indiana; October 27, 1909

Henry W. Mailand, a prominent and wealthy Marion township farmer, died at 3 o'clock Monday morning at the Lutheran hospital in this city at the age of 64 years. He had been a patient at the institution slightly more than a week, and death was due to stomach trouble following a surgical operation to which he submitted some days ago.

Mr. Mailand was born in Marion township and never married, living with his employes on the fine farm which he owned at Middletown, and he was one of the heavy stockholders in the Fort Wayne and Decatur trolley line. Surviving are two brothers and three sisters - Ferdinand and Charles Mailand, in Marion township; Mrs. Henry Schwartz, in Fort Wayne and Mrs. Fred Meyer, in Marion township [sic: only lists 2 sisters]. The remains were moved to the home of Mrs. Schwartz, 2526 Calhoun street, and later will be taken to the home of Charles Mailand. Funeral services Wednesday afternoon at 1 o'clock from the residence and later from St. John's Lutheran church at Bingen.
