JOHN KEMP DEAD

Former Monmouth Man
Died Last Night—Heart
Trouble, Complications.

WAS 66 YEARS OLD

Health Had Been Ailing
Since Last Summer—Pa-
ralysis at the Last.

John Kemp, aged sixty-six, former Monmouth resident, died last evening at 4:45 o'clock at the county infirmary, where he had been an inmate for a portion of three years. Death was due to heart trouble and a complication of ailments.

He first went to the infirmary three years ago where he spent a portion of two winters. Two summers he spent in Fort Wayne, working, but the third summer he was obliged to return to the infirmary after a short while, his health beginning to fail at that time. Since last September his mind also gave way and for the past two months it was necessary to keep him confined in a room because of his condition, which though not violent, was such that he destroyed his clothing and things about him. For the past week he had been unable to eat or drink or speak, and it was thought he might have suffered a paralytic attack at the last, in addition to the heart trouble with which he had been afflicted.

The deceased was married to Miss Artie Lord, of Monmouth, who died a few years ago. He leaves a sister living near Craigville; a brother, in Fort Wayne, and a number of other relatives.
