

Mrs. John Marker, who has been sick for the past five weeks, died this morning at 3:30 o'clock at her home on Short street. Deceased was eighty-one years of age and a member of the Radical United Brethren church. Paralysis caused her demise.

Susannah Marker was born in Montgomery county, Ohio, Nov. 19, 1819, and departed this life May 15, 1902, aged 82 years 5 months and 14 days. July 8, 1841 she was united in marriage with Jonathan Marker, who preceded her to the better land Dec. 16, 1888. To this union were born 12 children. Six have gone before leaving four sons and two daughters to mourn the loss of a loving mother. The sons are Albert Marker of Berne, Orion Marker of the west, Ira Marker, who is in Alaska, and Frank Marker of this city. The daughters are Mrs. Amos Mendenhall of Markle, Ind., and Miss Laura Marker, who has always resided with her mother.
