Mrs. Marie Boch Is Found Dead At Home

Funeral services will be held Monday for Mrs. Marie Boch, well-known Decatur lady, who was found dead at noon Friday at her home, 423 North Fifth street. Death was believed caused by a heart condition, for which she had been undergoing treatment for some time.

She was born in Decatur to Joseph and Mary Catherine Meibers Tonnellier, and was a lifelong resident of this city. She was highly active in church and school organizations her entire life. She was a graduate of the St. Joseph school and International Business College at Fort Wayne.

She was married to Dick Boch Oct. 16, 1916. Her husband, a former Adams county surveyor and engineer for the Indiana state highway department, died Feb. 6, 1961.

Mrs. Boch was a member of the St. Mary's Catholic church and the Rosary society.

Surviving are two sons, R. John Boch, acting postmaster of Decatur, and Robert T. Boch, assistant cashier of the First State Bank; two grandsons, Robert T. Boch, Jr., and John Allen Boch; and one sister, Miss Rose Tonnellier of Decatur. Two brothers are deceased.

Funeral services will be conducted at 9:15 a.m. Monday at St. Mary's Catholic church, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Simeon Schmitt officiating. Burial will be in the Catholic cemetery. Friends may call at the Zwick funeral home after 7 p.m. today until time of the services. The rosary will be recited by the Rosary society at 8 p.m. Sunday.
