Marie Deininger Dies At Hospital

Mrs. Marie Deininger, 65, member of a well known Decatur family, and wife of Richard G. Deininger, 411 North Fifth street, died at 8:10 a.m. Sunday at the Adams county memorial hospital. She had been ill for a long period of time and in serious condition for several weeks.

Born in Woodruff, W. Va., Jan. 15, 1900, she was a daughter of William and Mary Finnigan-Murtaugh, but had lived in Decatur most of her life. She was married to Richard G. Deininger March 6, 1943.

Mrs. Deninger, a former employee of Cloverleaf Creameries, was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church, the Rosary society, Catholic Ladies of Columbia, the American Legion auxiliary, So Cha Rea club, and the Monday Bridge club.

Surviving are her husband; one sister, Mrs. Walter (Jean) Gilliom of Decatur, and several nieces and nephews. Five brothers and one sister are deceased.

Funeral services will be conducted at 9:30 a.m. Wednesday at St. Mary's Catholic church with the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Simeon Schmitt officiating. Burial will be in the Catholic Cemetery. Friends may call at the Zwick funeral home after 7 p.m. today until time of the services. The rosary will be recited by the Rosary society and the C. L. of C. at 8 p.m. Tuesday.
