William E. Faurote Is Taken By Death

William E. Faurote, 77, prominent lifelong resident of Adams county died at 3 o'clock Thursday afternoon at his home on Decatur route 5, following an illness of four months of complications.

He was born in Adams county Nov. 6, 1884, a son of Frank and Sarah Brandyberry-Faurote, and was married to Mary C. Appelman Aug. 25, 1909. His wife preceded him in death in 1953.

After graduating from Monroe high school, Mr. Faurote attended Valparaiso University and taught school for many years in Adams county, and was a former employee of the First National Bank of Decatur. He was an agent for several insurance companies, farmed for a number of years, and also was an employee of the state highway department for 12 years.

Mr. Faurote was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church, the Third Order of St. Francis, Holy Name society, and an honorary member of the Fourth Degree, Knights of Columbus.

Surviving are five sons, John and Herman, at home, Leo and Edward Faurote, both of Decatur and James Faurote of Fort Wayne; five daughters, Mrs. Bernard (Helen) Lengerich, Mrs. Albert (Naomi) Braun, Mrs. Herman (Margaret) Braun, Mrs. Andrew (Bernadine) Appelman and Mrs. Leo (Germaine) Hackman, all of Decatur; 27 grandchildren; three brothers, Joseph and Simeon Faurote of Fort Wayne, and J. Henry Faurote of Decatur, and three sisters, Mrs. Fred (Margaret) Wagner and Miss Anna Faurote of Fort Wayne, and Mrs. Alfred (Rose) Rauch of Decatur. One son, two brothers and one sister are deceased.

Funeral services will be conducted at 9:15 a.m. Monday at St. Mary's Catholic church, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Simeon Schmitt officiating. Burial will be in the Catholic cemetery. The body was removed to the Gillig & Doan funeral home where friends may call after 1 p.m. Saturday until time of the services. The Third Order of St. Francis will recite the rosary at 7:30 p.m. Saturday and the Holy Name society at 8 p.m. Saturday.
