Fred Fullenkamp dies Sunday at hospital

Fred J. Fullenkamp, 78, of 311 North Second street, member of a prominent Decatur family and well known local businessman for more than 40 years, died at 9:30 a.m. Sunday at the Lutheran hospital in Fort Wayne, following an illness of one year.

Mr. Fullenkamp owned and operated Frickle's Lunch room, 135 South Second street, for more than 40 years before retiring two years ago.

A lifelong resident of this city, he was born in Decatur Aug. 4, 1890, the son of Jacob and Mary Klapehake-Fullenkamp, and was married to Esther Corbett Oct. 14, 1914. The couple observed their golden wedding anniversary in 1964.

Mr. Fullenkamp was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church, the Holy Name society, Loyal Order of Moose, and the Elks lodge.

Surviving are his wife; three daughters, Mrs. L. R. (Patricia) Zintsmaster of Clear Lake, Mrs. Jack (Rosemary) Holthouse of Decatur, and Mrs. James (Naureen) Egley of Chicago, Ill., two sisters, Mrs. Loretta Weissling and Miss Rose Fullenkamp, both of Findlay, O.; 12 grandchildren and one-great-grandchild. Five brothers and four sisters are deceased.

Funeral services will be conducted at 10 a.m. Wednesday at St. Mary's Catholic church, with the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Simeon Schmitt officiating. Burial will be in the Catholic cemetery. Friends may call at the Gillig-Doan & Sefton funeral home after 7 p.m. today until time of the services. The Moose lodge will hold memorial services at 7:30 p.m. today, and the rosary will be recited (rest is missing)
