

## Mary Hackman Dies Tuesday

Mary Hackman, 79, life long resident of Adams County, died Tuesday afternoon at 3:35 o'clock at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Victor Ulman, east of Decatur. Death was due to a heart attack and complications. Mrs. Hackman had been in ailing health for several months and became seriously ill a few hours before her death. She was born in Adams County on July 27, 1856, a daughter of Anthony and Louise Kurber-Spuller. She united in marriage to Barney Hackman, who preceded her in death about 30 years ago.

Survivors include two sons and two daughters: Mrs. Victor Ulman, Mrs. Sylvester Staub, Anselm Hackman of Decatur, and Anthony Hackman of Delvan, Wisconsin; and five sisters: Mrs. Isabell Meyers, Mrs. John Steigmeyer, Mrs. Mathias Thomas of Decatur; Mrs. Eve Starost of ft. Wayne and Sister M. Frederica of Fon du Lac, Wisconsin. One son died in infancy and two sisters preceded her in death. Mrs. Hackman was a member of the St. Mary's Catholic Church, the St. Mary's Society and the third order of St. Francis. Funeral services will be held Friday morning at 10 o'clock at the St. Mary's Catholic church and burial will be made in the Catholic cemetery. The body was removed to the Ulman home, east of Decatur this morning from the Yager Brothers funeral parlors.
