Victor Kable Dies After Long Illness

Victor D. Kable, 49, well known resident of Root township, three miles north of Decatur, died at 10 o'clock Monday night at the Irene Byron hospital, where he had been a patient since May 23.

Mr. Kable was an employee of the Decatur Casting Co. for 31 years before retiring in 1958 because of ill health.

He was born in Mercer county, O., Jan. 22, 1912, a son of John and Violet Baumgartner-Kable, and was married to Agnes Spangler May 6, 1930. He had lived in this community since 1927.

Mr. Kable was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church and the Holy Name society.

Surviving in addition to his wife are four sons, John V. Kable of Fort Wayne, David L. Kable of Decatur, and Daniel and Michael Kable at home; five daughters, Mrs. Floyd (Patricia) Balliet and Mrs. Charles (Jean) Henkenius, both of Decatur, and Misses Carole, Mary and Martha Kable, all at home; five grandchildren, and one sister, Mrs. Dale (Bessie) Eley of Fort Wayne. One brother and one sister are deceased.

Funeral services will be conducted at 9:15 a.m. Friday at St. Mary's Catholic church, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Simeon Schmitt officiating. Burial will be in the Catholic cemetery. Friends may call at the Zwick funeral home after 7 p.m. Wednesday until time of the services. The Holy Name society will recite the rosary at 8 p.m. Thursday.
