Charles C. Lose dies suddenly Monday noon

Charles C. Lose, 80, prominent retired Decatur barber, died suddenly shortly before noon Monday at the home of his daughter, Mrs. John Eichorn, 275 Park Place, with whom he had resided for several months.

Although he had been in failing health for two years, his death was unexpected.

Mr. Lose operated his own barber shop on Madison street for many years, and had barbered in this city for 63 years until his retirement a few years ago.

Born in Adams county Dec. 16, 1885, he was one of nine sons of John and Mary Ardner-Lose, and resided in this community his entire life. He was married to Miss Catherine Kriegel May 15, 1915. Mrs. Lose preceded him in death Dec. 10, 1954.

Mr. Lose was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church, the Holy Name society and the Knights of Columbus.

Surviving are the daughter, Mrs. John (Loreto) Eichhorn; three sons, Carl and Norbert Lose, both of Decatur, and Edward Lose of Cincinnati, O.; one brother, William Lose, Sr., of Decatur; and 16 grandchildren. One son, John, and seven brothers are deceased.

Funeral services will be conducted at 9:30 a.m. Thursday at the St. Mary's Catholic church, with Rt. Rev. Msgr. Simeon Schmitt officiating. Burial will be in the Catholic cemetery. Friends may call at the Gillig-Doan & Sefton funeral home after 12 noon Wednesday until time of the services. The rosary will be recited at 8 p.m.
