Mrs. Lillian Lose Dies This Morning

Mrs. Lillian E. Lose, 71, well known lifelong resident of Decatur, died at 1 o'clock this morning at the Johnson county memorial hospital at Franklin. Death was attributed to complications. She had been seriously ill for the past two months, becoming ill while visiting her daughters.

Born in Decatur July 31, 1890, she was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Meyer, and was married to Joseph Lose June 5, 1912. Her husband, who operated the Lose restaurant on North Second street for many years, preceded her in death Jan. 12, 1944.

Mrs. Lose was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church, the Rosary society and the Catholic Ladies of Columbia.

Surviving are one son, James Lose, of Decatur; two daughters, Mrs. Robert (Mary Helen) Eyles of Indianapolis, and Mrs. John (Marjorie) Gaughan of Needham route 1; 10 grandchildren; one brother, Arthur Meyer of Decatur, and four sisters, Mrs. Noble (Florence) Drum of Decatur, Mrs. Charles (Agnes) Starost of Fort Wayne, Mrs. Nimrod (Helena) McCullough of Decatur route 6, and Mrs. Barnard (Frances) Loshe of Decatur. One brother died in infancy.

The body was removed to the Gillig & Doan funeral home in this city where friends may call after 6 p.m. Tuesday. The rosary will be recited at 8 p.m. Wednesday. Funeral arrangements have not been completed, pending arrival of the daughters.
