Christina Schultz dies early today

Mrs. Christina M. Schultz, 81, lifelong resident of Adams county, and widow of John J. Schultz, prominent Adams county farmer, died early this morning at her home 234 North Fifth street. Although she had been in failing health for some time, her death was unexpected.

Born in Adams county Oct. 7, 1885, she was a daughter of John P. and Mary Luxenburger-Baker, and was married to John Schultz Nov. 6, 1907, and they operated a farm in Washington township for many years. Her husband preceded her in death in February of 1948.

Mrs. Schultz was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church, the Rosary society and the Catholic Ladies of Columbia.

Surviving are three daughters, sister M. Celeste, C.S.A., of Beloit, Wis., Sister M. Christine, C.S.A., of Monroe, Wis., and Sister M. Philomene, C.S.A. of Fon Du Lac, Wis., four sons, Leo, George, Joseph and Carl Schultz, all of Decatur; one brother, Frank C. Baker of Decatur route 4; one sister, Mrs. Mary Colfer, of Lafayette; 32 grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren. One son, Paul and one daughter, Gertrude, preceded her in death.

A Solemn Requiem high mass will be held at St. Mary's Catholic church at 10 a.m. Wednesday, with the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Simeon Schmitt in charge. Burial will be in the Catholic cemetery. Friends may call at the Gillig-Doan & Sefton funeral home after 7 p.m. today until time of the services. The rosary will be recited at 8 p.m. Tuesday.
