

**Decatur Daily Democrat, Adams County, IN; Thursday, January 3, 1946**

Mrs. Rose (Hackman) Staub, 63, wife of Sylvester Staub, 107 N. 5th street and a member of a prominent family of this county, died at 6:15 am at her home of an extended asthmatic ailment.

Born in this county [Adams] on May 24, 1882, Mrs. Staub was the daughter of Bernard and Mary (Spuller) Hackman, well known residents who formerly lived east of Decatur. She was married to Sylvester Staub April 20, 1904, and living in Seneca County, Ohio then returning to Adams county, Indiana in 1943.

Mrs. Staub was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church, the St. Mary's Society, and the third order of St. Francis.

Surviving besides her husband are, two sons Bernard Staub at home, Louis Staub of Decatur, IN. and one daughter, Helen (Staub) Gase of Ft. Wayne, IN. One son Lt. Fred Staub, a pilot, was killed in Germany over Emdem Harbor in July 1944, One sister, Anna (Hackman) Ulman of Decatur; two brothers, Anthony Hackman, Delvan, Wis. Anselm Hackman of Decatur, IN. also survive.

Funeral servies will be held at the Catholic church Saturday morning at 9 am Rev. Msgr. Joseph J. Siementz officiating. Burial will be in the Catholic cemetery.

The body will be removed from the Gillig and Doan Funeral home to the Staub residents today. Friends may call after 8pm.

The St. Mary's Society will meet at the home to recite the rosary.
