Mrs. Rose A. Tanvas Is Taken By Death

Mrs. Rose A. Tanvas, 78, lifelong resident of Decatur, died Wednesday night at her home, 440 Fornax street, following an illness of three months.

She was born in Decatur Nov. 12, 1885, a daughter of Peter and Julia Kuhn-Colchin, and was married to Alex Tanvas June 14, 1914. Her husband preceded her in death Aug. 28, 1945.

Mrs. Tanvas was employed at the Colchin package store in this city.

She was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church, the Rosary society, Third Order of St. Francis, St. Vincent de Paul society, the K. of C. auxiliary and the C. B. L. of I.

Surviving are one son, Vincent Tanvas of Fremont, O.; two daughters, Sr. M. Alexine, C.S.A., Fort Wayne, and Mrs. Berneta Omlor of Decatur, and one brother, Fred Colchin of Decatur. Three brothers and one sister preceded her in death.

Funeral services will be conducted at 9:30 a.m. Saturday at the St. Mary's Catholic church, with the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Simeon Schmitt officiating. Burial will be in the Catholic cemetery. The body was removed to the Gillig & Doan funeral home, where friends may call after 7 p.m. today until time of the services. The rosary will be recited at 8 p.m. Friday.
