A sad feature is that the man's family, which includes his wife and four children, is also in the hospital. The deceased moved to Elwood from here last February and was employed there in the munitions factory. Two brothers, Lawrence and Morris, were also employed there. Besides the widow, who was Miss Anna Spangler, and four children, he leaves his parents, Mr. and Mrs. George Tricker, of Farmdale, Ohio, and the following brothers and sisters: Mrs. Frank Railing, of east of the city; Mrs. Frank Bauserman, Geneva; Mrs. Roma Parent, Decatur; Crystal Tricker, at home; Jesse, of this city; and Lawrence and Morris, at Elwood.
