

Alfred J. Ulman dies last evening

Alfred J. Ulman, 80, lifelong resident of Adams county, and retired General Electric Co. employee, died at 8:30 p.m. Wednesday at his home, 117 North Fifth street, following an extended illness.

He was born in Adams county Feb. 5. 1889, a son of Mathias and Lavina Stub-Ulman, and was never married. He served with the U.S. Navy during World War 1.

Mr. Ulman was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church, the Holy Name society, Third Order of St. Francis, the Moose lodge, and Adams Post 43, American Legion.

Surviving are two sisters, Miss Lena Ulman and Mrs. Florian (Bertha) Geimer, both of Decatur; and two brothers, Victor and Bernard Ulman, both of Decatur. Three sisters and one brother are deceased.

Funeral services will be conducted at 10 a.m. Saturday at St. Mary's Catholic church, with the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Simeon Schmitt officiating. Burial will be in the Catholic cemetery, with graveside military rites by the American Legion. Friends may call at the Gillig-Doan & Sefton funeral home after 2 p.m. Friday until time of the services. The Third Order of St. Francis will recite the rosary at 7:30 p.m. Friday, followed by the Holy Name society at 8 p.m. (2-19-1969)
