### Clement Voglewede Is Taken By Death

Clement W. Voglewede, 80, member of a pioneer Adams county family, died late Saturday morning at his home, 227 South Fifth street. He had been in failing health for the past two years with complications.

Born in Adams county Dec. 29, 1878, he was a son of Henry and Mary Meibers-Voglewede, and lived here his entire life. He was married to Minnie Coffee June 26, 1906. He operated a shoe repair shop on West Monroe street for many years until his retirement.

Mr. Voglewede was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church, the Holy Name society, the Knights of Columbus, and the B.P.O. Elks lodge, of which he was a past exalted ruler.

Surviving in addition to his wife are a son, Cedric Voglewede, at home, and three sisters, Mrs. Clara Haefling of Fort Wayne, Mrs. Mary Haefling of Indianapolis and Mrs. Rose Fisher of Huntington. Three brothers and two sisters preceded him in death.

Funeral services will be conducted at 9:15 a.m. Tuesday at the St. Mary's Catholic church the Very Rev. Simeon Schmitt officiating. Burial will be in the Catholic cemetery. Friends may call at the Gillig & Doan funeral home until time of the services. The rosary will be recited at 8 o'clock this evening.
