

Mrs. Theresa Wolpert, aged seventy-one years, and one of the best known women in our city, died last evening at her home on Marshal Street, at nine o'clock, after an illness dating back three years, death resulting from a complication of the diseases.

The deceased was born in Germany, where she resided with her parents until eight years of age when they came to America and soon afterward established themselves in a home in this county. She received her early education here and was reared to womanhood and watched the growth of our city from a wilderness to its present flourishing condition. She was beloved by all who knew her, she being of a kind disposition that served to draw people nearer to her and she will be sadly missed by those who came in closest touch with her.

Three years ago she began to decline in health, although her illness at that time did not seem to be serious, but she gradually failed until five weeks ago, when she was forced to take to her bed and from that time on her decline was rapid, death relieving her last evening.

She was a devoted member of the St. Mary's Catholic church from where the funeral will be held Monday morning at nine o'clock sun time. Father Wilken officiating, and internment will be made in the St. Joseph Cemetery.

She leaves seven daughters, namely, Mrs. Joseph Malley, Chicago, Ill: Mrs. John Losse, Mrs. Mike Bogner, Mrs. John (Rose) Baker, and Misses Anna, Sophia and Kate Wolpert of the city: also two sons, Andrew and Joseph Wolpert to mourn their loss.
