**DIES SUDDENLY AT LIMA HOME**

**Kit Cowen, Former Adams County Resident Expires After Operation**

Kit Carson Cowen (sic), former postmaster of Rivarre, and well known in this city, died at his home at Lima, O., at four o'clock this morning, after an operation for goiter had been performed a few days ago. Cowen was 44 years at the time of his death.

Mr. Cowen is a former resident of Decatur. He was born in St. Mary's township, this county, and spent most of his life in this vicinity until a few years ago when he moved to Lima, O., where the death occurred. He visited here \_\_ecoration Day.

Surviving him is one sister Mrs. Jesse Steele, of Pleasant Mills, Indiana. Funeral services will be held at Lima at 9 o'clock Friday morning and at Mt. Tabor Methodist church, Rivarre at ten o'clock. Internment will be held in the Methodist cemetery at Pleasant Mills.

The pastor of the Mt. Tabor church of Rivarre will have charge of the services there. Mr. Cowen's father preceded him in death in 1909 and his mother died in 1914.
