

A LONG ILLNESS

Terminats (sic) in the Death of Mrs. Charles W. Hower of Near Rivarre
Died Monday Night
Had Been Ill Two Years of Bright's Disease
Funeral Thursday

Elmira Dailey Hower, wife of Charles W. Hower, of Tennessee, died last night at midnight at the home of Mrs. Hower's parents near Rivarre. Mrs. Hower has been ill the past two years of Bright's disease, which was the cause of her death. When her health began to fail they came here from Tennessee and resided at the Hower home since that time.

Mrs. Hower, who was born in 1874, was a native of this county. She was a daughter of Joseph and Samantha Dailey. The father is living in Blue Creek township, but the mother is dead.
