FUNERAL OF DECATUR VETERAN FRIDAY

Decatur, Ind., Feb. 14 - Funeral serves for Andrew Jackson Teeple, the civil war veteran whose death occurred late yesterday afternoon after an illness since Friday, will be held Friday morning at 10 o'clock from the Methodist church, with the Rev. H. L? Semans officiating. Burial in the Mount Tabor cemetery at Rivarre where his wife is laid away. Mr. Teeple was 78 years and 9 months of age. He was born in Morrow county, Ohio, but at the age of 12 came with his parents to this county, settling in St. Mary's township. He was married to Miss Achsah M. Thomas and they lived in St. Mary's township until her death, November 3, 1900, when Mr. Teeple came to this city to reside with his only son and child, Charles Teeple, at whose home his death occurred. He served in the civil war in Company K, 87th(?) infantry, and was made lieutenant. He is the last commissioned officer of that company. He leaves besides his one son, Charles, who of five sons survive (very difficult to read), the following brothers and sisters: Thomas and George, of this city; Mrs. Elijah Walters, of Decatur, and Mrs. Emma Zimmerman, of Cedarville. Mr. Teeple was a member of the G. A. R. and the Masons.
