

BRYCE L. TROUTNER IS TAKEN BY DEATH

Funeral Services Tuesday Afternoon

Bryce L. Troutner, 31, a veteran of World War II, died at 6:45 o'clock Saturday evening at the Adams county memorial hospital. He had been ill for five days of hemorrhages from stomach ulcers.

He was born May 26, 1919 in Willshire, O., the son of Linsay (sic) and Anna Rash-Troutner, and resided with his mother at 418 Johns street. His father died seven years ago.

The veteran entered service March 18, 1941, and served with the 112th cavalry in the South Pacific for two years. He was later transferred to the military police in the air corps. Following his discharge after five years of service, he moved to Decatur and was employed at Krick-Tyndall.

He was a member of the Homer Pierson American Legion post at Willshire.

Surviving in addition to his mother are two brothers, Carl and Wayne Troutner, both of Decatur, and five sisters, Mrs. Inez Moore of South Whitley, Mrs. Helen Fawcett of Van Wert, O., Mrs. Beulah Lautzenheiser and Mrs. Opal Andrews, both of Decatur and Mrs. Grace Foor of Garrett.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday at the Black funeral home, the Rev. L. T. Norris officiating. Burial will be in Mt. Tabor cemetery. The Willshire Legion post will conduct military rites. Friends may call at the funeral home until time of the services.
