

Decatur Democrat, Adams Co, IN; Friday, 4 May 1883.

In St. Mary's township, Adams county, Indiana, died on the 21st of April 1883, Nathaniel Lewis, in his 88th year.

He was born in Belmont county, O., in 1796. In 1817 he made a profession of religion; was baptized in Licking Run, Kentucky, and united with the Baptist church, Paris Kentucky. He moved to Richmond, Indiana, about the year 1828, where he engaged in the saddlery and harness business. At the time of his sickness and death he was making his home with the family of Mr. John Rubey, near Willshire, Ohio, where he was kindly cared for by the family and his friend and relative, Mr. Wilson.

The funeral service was conducted by Rev. D. B. Reckard, in the Baptist church, Willshire, Ohio, after which the remains were taken about one and a half mile from Willshire, where they were laid along side of a loved sister to await the resurrection of the just.
