WILL IS PROBATED

DECATUR, Ind. Oct. 5 - The will of Mrs. Manerva Fravel, late of Wabash township, was probated in the Adams circuit court. The will was written December 20, 1913, and witnesses were Andrew S. Burkey and John T. Nevil. She asked that she be buried in the Crawford cemetery, Wabash township, and that a tombstone, not to exceed \$75 in cost, be erected for herself, her husband, W. J. Fravel, and their daughter, Elizabeth Twigg. She asked that her personal estate be sold and the proceeds used in paying any debts and expenses and the bequests. She gives to the Christian Benevolent society of St. Louis, Mo., the sum of \$100. The remainder of the estate is to be divided equally among her three grandchildren, Enos, Nathan and George Faulkner Twigg; Lucinda Catharine Schirmeyer. She asked that George W. Fravel and George B. Maurer serve as executors.
