Abraham Rawley died at his home on East Water street shortly after midnight, Tuesday, November 15. His death was due to cancer, from which he suffered more or less for two years. For over a week previous to his death he suffered severely and his death was daily expected.

Mr. Rawley was born in Clark Co., Ohio, Jan. 15, 1838. When a boy four years old he was taken to this state and was reared on a farm in Wabash township of this county, where he was engaged in farming before moving to Berne. He was married, November 19, 1861, to Mary Jane Crawford, to this union five daughters were born, two of whom are still living. They are Mrs. Edna Picket and Mrs. Wm. Farlow. His first wife died in December of the year 1881 and in March, 1888, he married Lovina Long, daughter of Isaac Long, Lima, Ohio. This last union was blessed with three boys and one girl now about 6 months old.

The funeral services were held at the Evangelical church yesterday afternoon. Burial took place at the Crawford cemetery east of town.
