ISAAC TEETER DIES SATURDAY AT INFIRMARY  
Well Known Man, Dies at Age of 80; Many Relatives  
BURIAL TUESDAY AT MAPLE GROVE

Isaac Teeter, aged 80, for many years a resident of east of Berne, died Saturday afternoon shortly before 1 o'clock at the Adams county infirmary. Death was caused by infirmities of old age. He had been sick for several days. Mr. Teeter had been at the infirmary for three years.

Born in Darke county, Ohio, Jan. 21, 1855, Mr. Teeter reached the age of 80 years, 8 months and 21 days. He came to this community when a young man and lived east of Berne for many years. In early life he was married to Alice Glancey. About 17 years ago they moved from here to Scottsburg, Indiana, then to Kansas, where Mrs. Teeter died. Mr. Teeter then came back and lived east of Berne until three years ago.

Surviving are two daughters and two sons, Mrs. Ed Elliot of Argos, Indiana; Mrs. Charles Leonard of Eldorado, Kansas; William Teeter of Flint, Michigan and John Teeter of Geneva. Four children preceded.

Three brothers and one sister survive, Sam, John and Milton Teeter, all of east of Berne, and Mrs. Wesley Scoles of Hemlock, Michigan.

One brother, Calvin Teeter, and one sister, Mrs. Harvey Harruff preceded, also five brothers and sisters in infancy.

The body was taken to the Sam Teeter home east of town. The funeral will be held Tuesday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock at the Teeter home and at 2 o'clock at the Maple Grove church, Rev. F. W. Piety officiating, assisted by Rev. Frank Johnson. Burial will be in Crawford cemetery.
