HARVEY BEER DIES AT BERNE

Death Follows Three Months Illness; Widow and Five Children Survive

Berne, Ind., Aug. 6 - (Special) Harvey Beer, aged 38, died at 5:55 o'clock Sunday morning, August 5, 1928, at his home in Berne. Death followed a three months illness with symptoms of tuberculosis.

Harvey Beer, a son of Mr. and Mrs. C. C. Beer, of Monroe township, was born December 20, 1889, in Monroe Township, Adams County, Indiana. Fourteen years ago, he united in marriage with Mrs. Rose Beer, who survives him together with five small children as follows: Ellen, aged 12 years; Ralph, aged 10 years; Irene, aged 7 years; Iona, aged 3 years; and Sara Belle, aged one year.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. C. C. Beer and the following brothers and sisters also survive: Mrs. Fred Pickford and Mrs. Noah Roth, of Decatur; Mrs. Ed Rich of Monroe Township; Miss Della Beer at home; Miss Caroline Beer of Ft. Wayne; Mrs. Ed Speeheger of Linn Grove; Mrs. Henry Nussbaum of Monroe township; Mrs. Floyd Schindler of Berne; Ermin Been of Berne; and Elmer, Raymond and Merlin Beer, at home.

For five years, Harvey followed the occupation of farmer, but eight years ago he moved his family to Berne, where he was employed by the Berne Hardware Company. About three months ago, his failing health forced him to give up his employment. Most of the time since, he was confined to his bed.

The deceased has been a member of the Cross Reformed church since his confirmation in 1907. He was a member of the consistory (?) and served as a deacon for more than three years.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Cross Reformed Church. Deacons of the church consistory will act as pall bearers at the funeral and Rev. C. H. W. (blurry) will officiate. Burial will be made at the MRE Cemetery.
