John P. Mazelin Taken by Death on Saturday

Funeral Here Tuesday for Local Man, 86

John P. Mazelin, 86, 665 Sprunger Street, widely known retired carpenter, died at 12:45 pm Saturday at the Adams County Memorial Hospital where he was admitted two weeks ago. Death was due to a cerebral hemorrhage.

Mr. Mazelin had been in failing health for several years and became seriously ill three weeks ago. He was a lifelong resident of this community.

In addition to being a carpenter for many years, Mr. Mazelin built and owned the former Jefferson Garage building on North Jefferson, later selling it. The building now is occupied by Berne Electric. He also owned the building on Main Street which housed the former Mennonite Book Concern before it was destroyed by fire.

He was born in Monroe Township October 23, 1880, a son of Menno Peter and Albertina Kipfer Mazelin. He was married to Rosa Kirschner Buhler September 29, 1923, in Brooklyn, New York. She preceded in death in 1960.

Surviving are two daughters, Gerda S. Mazelin and Helen P. Mazelin, both of Berne and a brother, Joel Mazelin, Port Treverton, Pennsylvania.

Mr. Mazelin attended the Grace Bible Church.

Services will be held at 10 am Tuesday at the Yager Funeral Home, where friends may call. Rev. Ivan French will officiate and burial will be in the MRE Cemetery.
