Widow of Dan Moser is Dead from Infection

Mrs. Melinda Fox Moser, 75 Dies After 2 Day Illness

Mrs. Melinda Fox Moser, aged 75, widow of the late Dan Moser, died Saturday evening at Indianapolis from a throat infection. Mrs. Moser, a resident of this community most of her life, died in an Indianapolis hospital after a very brief illness. She was sick only two days, and her death came as a great shock to her relatives.

Mrs. Moser's husband died eight years ago and since then she had been staying with relatives. The Moser-Gaddis evangelistic party has been holding services at Indianapolis and she was with them when she became ill.

Mrs. Moser was born in French township in January of 1864. She was a daughter of Michael and Elizabeth Captain Fox. She was married to Dan Moser early in life and they lived for many years on a farm in French township northwest of Berne. Surviving are the following children: Mrs. Frank Ritthaller, Groveland, Illinois; Della Decatur Albert, Rapid Falls, South Dakota; Wilbur, San Francisco; Levi, Van Nuys, Calif.' Mrs. Rachel Gaddis, Elma and Bertha Moser all of Olivet, Illinois; Pearl, South Bend; Jess, Fort Wayne.

Mrs. Edwin Bruechy and William Moser are deceased, also all of her brothers and sisters.

The funeral was held at 11 o'clock this afternoon at an Indianapolis funeral home. The body was then brought here and burial was made this afternoon in the M.R.E. cemetery west of Berne.
