Other survivors include a son, Thomas Muselman of Berne; a brother; Art Muselman of Berne; a sister, Ruth Steury of Fort Wayne; and six grandchildren. He was preceded in death by two sons, John A. and James H. Muselman; and two sisters, Carolyn Russett and Pauline Muselman.

Due to renovations at First Missionary Church, funeral services will be held at First Mennonite Church in Berne at 10:30 a.m. on Wednesday. Calling hours are Tuesday from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. at Yager-Kirchhofer Funeral Home in Berne, and for one hour prior to the services Wed. at the church.
