Harold Schindler, 68, of Berne, a former Adams County deputy sheriff and prior to that a truck driver for the Dunbar Furniture Co. for 25 years, died at 2 p.m. Sunday at the Adams County Memorial Hospital, following a 10-year illness.

Mr. Schindler was a deputy sheriff for eight years, and also served as a chief deputy. He was forced to retire a number of years ago due to ill health.

He was a member of the Trinity United Methodist Church.

Born in Hesperia, Mich., on July 7, 1911, he was the son of John and Emma Stucky-Schindler, and was married in July of 1933 in Kentucky.
