Brief Illness Fatal to Henry W. Schug, 54

Services Here Tuesday for Long-Time G. E. Employee

Henry W. Schug, 54, 365 Parkway Drive, this city, died at 2:50 pm Saturday at the Adams County Memorial Hospital following a brief illness.

Death was attributed to a cerebral hemorrhage. He was stricken in his home early Sunday morning, March 20 and had been in a critical condition since.

Mr. Schug was a precision grinder at the Decatur plant of the General Electric Company, where he was employed 29 ½ years. He was a member of the General Electric Quarter Century Club and was a veteran of World War II. He enlisted in the Navy and served 21 months, 17 months overseas. He served from March 1944 to December 20, 1945.

A native of Hartford City, Mr. Schug was born August 6, 1916, a son of Jesse A. and Birdie Hoffman Schug. He was united in marriage to Kathryn Teeter. Mr. Schug, except for residing in Detroit for some time early in his life, was a lifetime resident of this community.

He was a member of the Cross United Church of Christ.

Surviving are the wife, a son, Steven A. Schug, Berne; two daughters, Mrs. Raymond Velez, North Madison, Ohio and Mrs. Keith (Scherri) Krieg, Huntington; eight grandchildren; the mother, Mrs. Birdie Schug of Decatur; three brothers, Philip Schug, San Antonio, Texas; Frederick Schug, Fort Wayne and Robert O. Schug, Lima, Ohio and two sisters, Mrs. Richard (Jennie) Keller, Decatur and Mrs. Corabelle Beer, Decatur. A sister, Lois, died in infancy.
