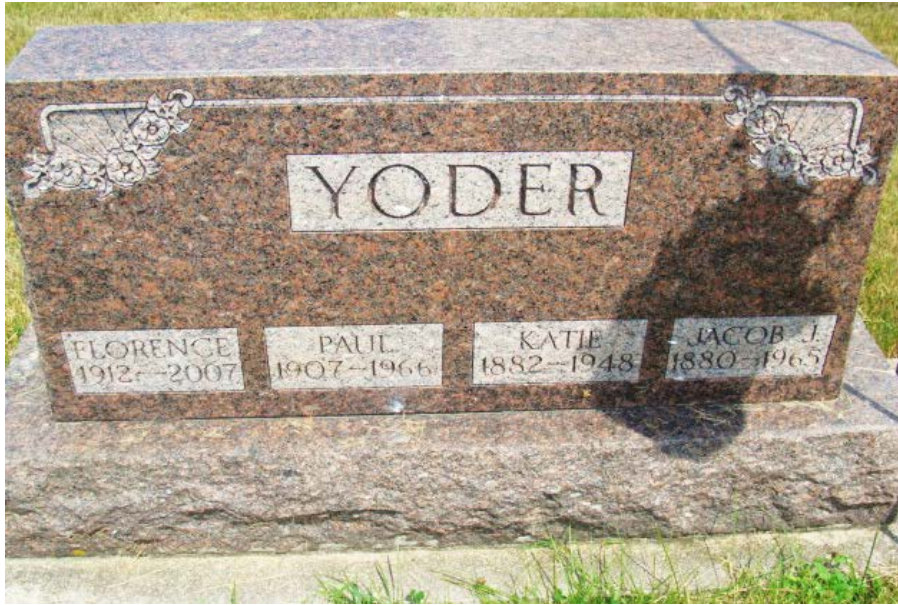

Linn Grove Garage Owner, 58, Dies Wednesday

Funeral services will be held Saturday at 10:00 am at the Vera Cruz United Church of Christ with Rev. George F. Reusser officiating for Paul Yoder, 58, of Linn Grove who died Wednesday afternoon, at 12:30 in the Adams County Memorial Hospital. Death was attributed to a heart attack. Burial will take place at the MRE Cemetery.

Mr. Yoder, a lifelong resident of Adams County, was born in Monroe Township, a son of Jacob J. and Katherine Moser Yoder on December 21, 1907. He was married to the former Florence Meyer on April 21, 1934.

He was a member of the Geneva F&AM Lodge and was a 32 degree Scottish Rite Mason. He was active in 4-H work and was well-known as a swine breeder. Up until his death he operated a garage and machine shop in Linn Grove.

Mr. Yoder, who was widely known, had not been well for some time. He and his wife were injured in the Palm Sunday 1965 tornado when their fine farm home and other

buildings near Linn Grove was swept away and Mr. Yoder's Linn Grove garage badly damaged. Mr. and Mrs. Yoder had rebuilt their farm home and were living in it. He had his fatal attack while working on a tractor in his shop late Tuesday afternoon.

Mr. Yoder was active in extension projects and always took a prominent part in the 4-H fair. He was recognized far and wide for his fine hogs.

He is survived by his wife; one son, Max N., of Washington, D.C., a daughter, Sherrill E., a student at Ball State University, Muncie; three brothers, Daniel and Felix of Berne and Jerome of Bluffton and two sisters, Esther Yoder and Mrs. George (Lois) Zuercher of Linn Grove. Two brothers, Aaron and Phillip preceded in death at infancy.
