Jack E. Madden, 77, 103 E, Deepwater Court, Geneva, died Saturday morning at Adams County Memorial Hospital.

Madden retired in 1983 as a truck driver for Kenosha Auto Transport of Fort Wayne. He was a member of the Geneva Lions Club, Teamsters No. 414, VFW Post 6751 in Geneva, and the American Legion Post 468 in Berne.

A graduate of Churubusco High School, he served during World War II in the Air Force from 1945 to 1948 where he was an aerial engineer. He then served in the Air Force Reserves in Fort Wayne.

Madden moved from the Churubusco-Fort Wayne area to Geneva 17 years ago.

Born Aug. 11, 1926, in Churubusco, he was the son of Harry E. and Drussella (Gandy) Madden. He was married in 1957 in Albion to Dorothy Fravel, who survives.

Surviving besides his wife are one daughter, Mrs. Michael (Janet) Fisher, Valparaiso; one son, William W. Madden, San Jose, Calif.; one stepson, Chalmer Landis Jr., Germantown, Tenn.; and one granddaughter.
