Charles Springer dies at Bluffton

Charles H. Springer, 85, of Geneva, a retired farmer, died at 12:20 a.m. Saturday at the Bluffton clinic. He had been in ill health several months.

Born near Pleasant Mills on May 10, 1889, he was the son of Lewis and Esther Matheson-Springer, and was married on March 26, 1910, to Myra M. Wolfe, who died in 1971.
